Treasurer's report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2025

The charity incurred net expenditure for the year of £8,746 compared with £2,454 in 2024. Total income received during the year amounted to £35,812 (2024 - £30,345) and expenditure incurred of £44,558 (2024 - £32,799).

The charity continued with its programme of lectures and excursions, published its twice-yearly member newsletter and a copy of the annual Proceedings. In addition, it published *The Building Stones of Suffolk* by Tony Redman with subsequent sales more than covering the cost of printing.

The Anthony Wheeler Conference was held at the Hold in Ipswich and focussed on new discoveries from development-led archaeology in Suffolk.

Grants paid out during the year amounted to £15,628 compared with £10,485 in 2024.

The Charity's principal sources of income continued during the year including positive book sales, income from the Anthony Wheeler Conference and contributions to the cost of the Proceedings. Membership numbers remained stable during the year, however, recorded income from subscriptions in the accounts was lower than 2024 arising from the timing of receipts at year ends.

The Charity continued to receive favourable returns on funds held in longer term deposit accounts with banks.

Total available funds carried forward at the year-end amounted to £266,305 of which £257,480 was held in cash balances in readily accessible bank accounts and in longer term deposit accounts.
